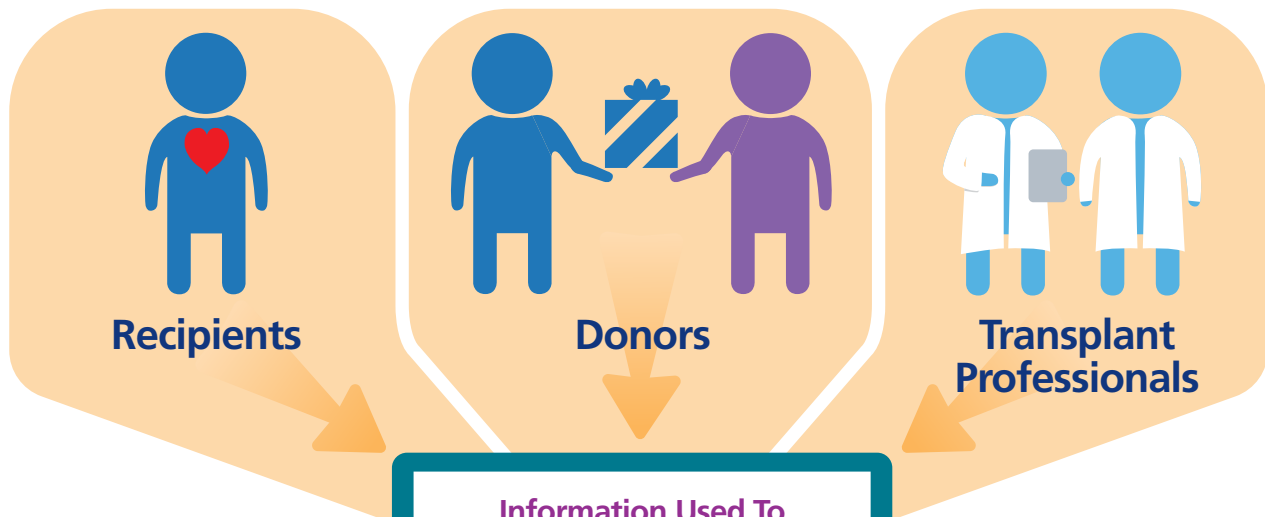

Policies



Patients, donor families, and transplant professionals make the OPTN policies that guide organ matching.

OPTN Policy Development

- Committee identifies issue
- Investigates options
- Develops proposal
- Seeks feedback from transplant community and general public
- Revises proposal
- Provides proposal to Board of Directors for review and possible approval
- Approved proposal becomes policy

Policies are constantly improved based on transplants that have occurred in the U.S.

Public Information

The Scientific Registry of Transplant Recipients (SRTR) helps patients and the transplant community understand patients' experiences:

- While awaiting a transplant
- After transplant

The OPTN (Organ Procurement and Transplantation Network) maintains a nationwide computer network linking donors and transplant candidates.

OPTN national policies drive the order in which patients receive organ offers.
